These additional resources allow us to continue offering state-of-the-art facilities and top-tier equipment to the men and women referred to our sheet metal contractor partners.

Apprenticeship programs in the sheet metal workers industry are vital for the individuals entering the trade and the industry as a whole. Our apprenticeship schools play a pivotal role in this process, providing education, mentorship, and opportunities that empower apprentices to succeed in their careers. As our industry continues to evolve, these programs will remain key in fostering a skilled workforce.

Located in Waller and Orange, Texas, the Houston Area Sheet Metal Training Center holds a Platinum accreditation level and offers nine instructors, led by Training erodriguez@smart54jatc.org. Director Chris Romo. The HASMTC is affiliated with-and funded through-

Houston and Sabine Community Colleges. The center offers a four-year program, and currently enrolls 90 apprentices who attend classes two nights per week, with classes starting at 5:30 p.m. The apprentices log 224 hours per year in training. Journeyperson update classes, a.k.a. Continuing Education Units, are offered from February to April.

The HASMTC is housed in a brandnew, state-of-the-art facility, which was completed only three years ago. Its latest equipment addition is a plasma table, which was installed last semester. The center is considering adding a laser welder in the future.

The Joint Apprenticeship Training Committee meets on the last Monday of each month at 4:30 p.m.

various welding certifications, plus hoisting and rigging.



Trey Berryman has been teaching the trade for five years. His current focus is welding instruction, with an emphasis on industrial sheet metal welding.


Berryman's employer was CWI; he was with the company for 24 years. He's retired, now, after 41 years as a SMART member.

The San Antonio Area is home to the primary for Sheet Metal Workers Local 67 JATC, while the Austin Area serves as a secondary training center. With its Platinum accreditation level, the JATC has 11 instructors and is an AWS Accredited Test

The center has a total of 78 apprentices enrolled in the program:

1st Year: 28 apprentices 2nd Year: 24 apprentices 3rd Year: 16 apprentices 4th Year: 10 apprentices

Apprentices are required to complete four years of classroom-related training, totaling 800 hours. This includes 200 hours per year of evening classes held from September through May, with five classes scheduled per month from 5 to 9:15 p.m., plus 7,200 hours of on-the-job training with a signatory contractor.

The JATC is affiliated with Excelsior College through the National College Credit Recommendation Service. Funding comes via a wage allocation as outlined in its CBA between members and signatory employer contractors. Those funds are paid directly to the LU 67 JATC Trust Fund, and are designated for member training.

The center offers journeyperson update classes.

The JATC boasts the latest equipment, including a new laser welder, a Trimble Robotic Total Station, a software update for its AUTODESK 2025, and a mobile training/recruitment lab. The JATC also is developing a new training center, which is slated to include a computer lab, a TAB lab, a service lab, a welding lab, a fire and life safety lab, and a state-of-the-art laser cutting system.

Planned projects for the current facility in order to prepare it for sale are:

Sealing tilt wall separations Obtaining a price estimate for roof repairs Cleaning the front windows and side window covers

night on Mondays.

The secondary night for all apprentices varies from week to week. All apprentices are required to have 200 class hours per year; the JATC schedules 50 four-hour class nights per year.

The training center aims to have its stateof-the-art IPG laser welder up and running this year inside its custom-built enclosure. The welding lab also has been upgraded with new Miller Dynasty welding machines and a 4x8 Flextur welding table. It also added a 5-foot, 10-gauge power roll and a power roller that can roll round and square tube, pipe from 3/4 inch to 2 inches, angle iron, and channel the easy and hard way. It also has upgraded its computer lab with 16 new work stations and brand-new computers and computer systems, delivering PCs that can handle the workload. Apprentices are using Revit these days, which is a more widely used version of AutoCAD.

Other improvements to the facility include remodeled bathrooms, updated welding booths, and new security cameras throughout the building, as well as an autolocking front door. Further improvements include asphalt in the parking lot, new exterior paint, new flooring in the offices,

painted flooring in the breakroom and hallways, and new interior paint in the offices and classrooms.

JATC members include James L. May, SWGCRC; Leroy T. Sensat, Young and Pratt; Aaron Scott, TCS Mechanical-Austin; Adam Roche, DSI; Scott Rostro, DSI; and Daniel Anderson.

Meetings are held the first Monday of each month at 5 p.m. Every other month, a second meeting is held on the second Thursday at 2 p.m.




